A fun packed day was had by all 2nd Year pupils who attended the JCSP-funded trip to Dunmore East Adventure Centre recently. All the boys got involved in four modules:- (1) Team challenges – improving their communication, leadership, time management, participation and teamwork skills. (2) The group then took a coastal walk to Portally Cove along which they observed features of coastal erosion and deposition. (3) Classroom based activities... such as chart/map work and worksheets as well as identifying features with the aid of a map. (4) Finally, pupils took part in orienteering in the park – revision of feature identification, pedal-boat orienteering, 'Wibit Wipeout' – a water fun session, while focusing all the time on safety aspects and dangers related to an adventure activity.
